INTRODUCTION

WHAT IS THE CROWN ACT?

As an extension of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, California Senate Bill 188, most notably known as the CROWN (Creating a Respectful and Open World for Natural Hair) Act, is intended to provide necessary protection to all people at risk of hair discrimination due to their racial and ethnic identity.

The Act was marketed a huge success for Black women professionals.



- Efforts to pass legislation on the federal level have not been successful.
- This piece of legislation will significantly benefit LGBTQ+ members of the Black community; however, Black LGBTQ+ positioning is, once again, not acknowledged within Black social movement.



QUEERPHENOMENOLOGY

Queer phenomenology seeks to answer the seemingly simple question of how "queered bodies" are oriented in relation to the lines and shapes carved out by cis-het normativity.

Empowering one another.



FINDINGS

Two prominent themes were discovered:





Hair is a vital part of Black and queer gender expression, especially for trans people during their transition.



Safe grooming spaces are hard to come by for Black, queer people due discomfort and vulnerability, and queer disorientation with cisheteronormativity and its proximity to whiteness.

GOINGFORWARD

Extending Ahmed's **queer phenomenology** into Black social spaces; the exclusion of LGBTQ+ people from Black sociopolitical movement should no longer be accepted.

GONGFORWARD

Call for pro-Black, pro-woman, and pro-LGBTQ+ lawmakers to **apply the necessary pressures** to local, state, and federal legislative bodies for the immediate passage of the CROWN Act.

FOOD FOR THOUGHT

In a world that's anti-Black, anti-LGBTQ+, anti-woman, and anti-free thought, how will you be the change outside of this program?
